Finished Quilt Size: 107" x 107"

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Supplies Needed:

- ◆ Rotary cutter and mat (min. 18" x 24")
- ◆ Rulers: 6" x 24", 6" x 12" & 12" square
- ◆ I recommend a "Wing Clipper and a "Tucker Trimer" by Deb Tucker (very helpful but not required)
- ◆ Basic sewing supplies

Fabric requirements:

- ◆ Fab. #1 7" x 22" piece
- ◆ Fab. #3 8" x 22" piece
- ◆ Fab. #6 5" x 10" piece
- ◆ Fab. #12 5" x 22" piece
- ◆ Fab. #13 5" x 9" piece

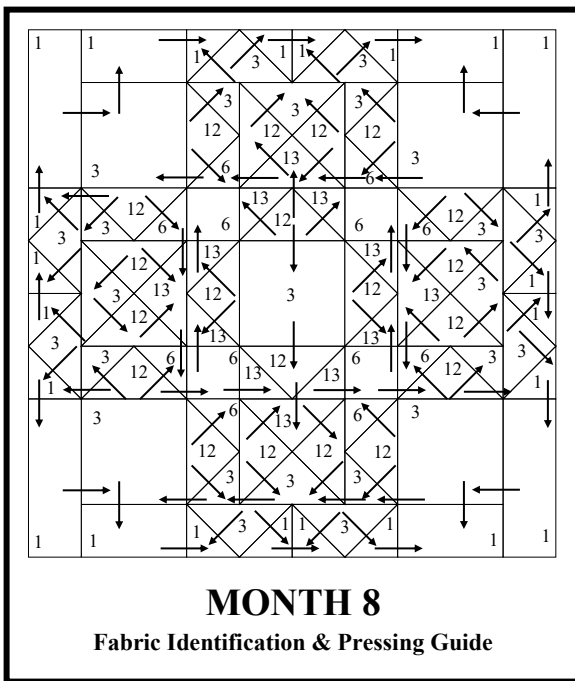

COTTON TREASURE DESIGN

Turning Cotton into Treasure

**Piecing...
Flying Geese**

- Take 2 - 3½" squares of Fab. # 3 and 8 - 2" squares of Fab. # 1.
Following instructions in the Reference Guide make 8 FG.
Trim each to 1½" x 2½" rectangle.
Sew them together into pairs.
- Take 1 - 3½" square of Fab. # 12 and 4 - 2" squares of Fab. # 13.
Following instructions in the Reference Guide make 4 FG.
Trim each to 1½" x 2½" rectangle.
- Take 2 - 3½" squares of Fab. # 12, 4 - 2" squares of Fab. # 6 and 4 - 2" squares of Fab. # 3. Follow the instruction below.

A. Mark a diagonal line on wrong side of all the smaller squares.

B. With right sides together align two 2" squares of Fab. # 6 with opposite corners of the 3½" square of Fab. # 12.
Sew together with a scant ¼" seam allowance on each side of the drawn line.
Repeat for the second square.

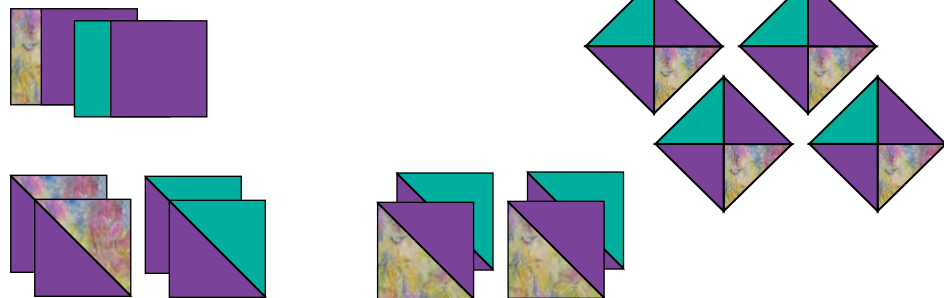
C. Cut apart on the drawn line to make two triangle units, open small triangles on each unit and press carefully to the outside. Repeat for the second square.
Make sure that you **DO NOT** stretch the wings.

D. Align a marked 2" square of Fab. # 3 with remaining corner of the triangle unit. Sew together with a scant ¼" seam allowance on each side of the drawn line.

E. Cut apart on the drawn line, open small triangles on each unit and carefully press to the outside.
Repeat for the next 3 sets.
Trim each to 1½" x 2½" rectangle.

You should now have 4 FG with fabric # 3 on the left and 4 FG "mirror image" with fabric #3 on the right.

- Quarter Square Triangles (QST)**
Take 2 - 3½" squares of Fab. # 12, 1 - 3½" square of Fab. # 3 and 1 - 3½" square of Fab. # 13.
Following instructions in the Reference Guide make 4 QST.
In step # 4 use 1 HST with colour # 9 and one HST with colour # 13.
Trim each to 2½" x 2½" square.



**FOR PRESSING AND SEAM ORIENTATION
REFER TO THE PRESSING GUIDE.**

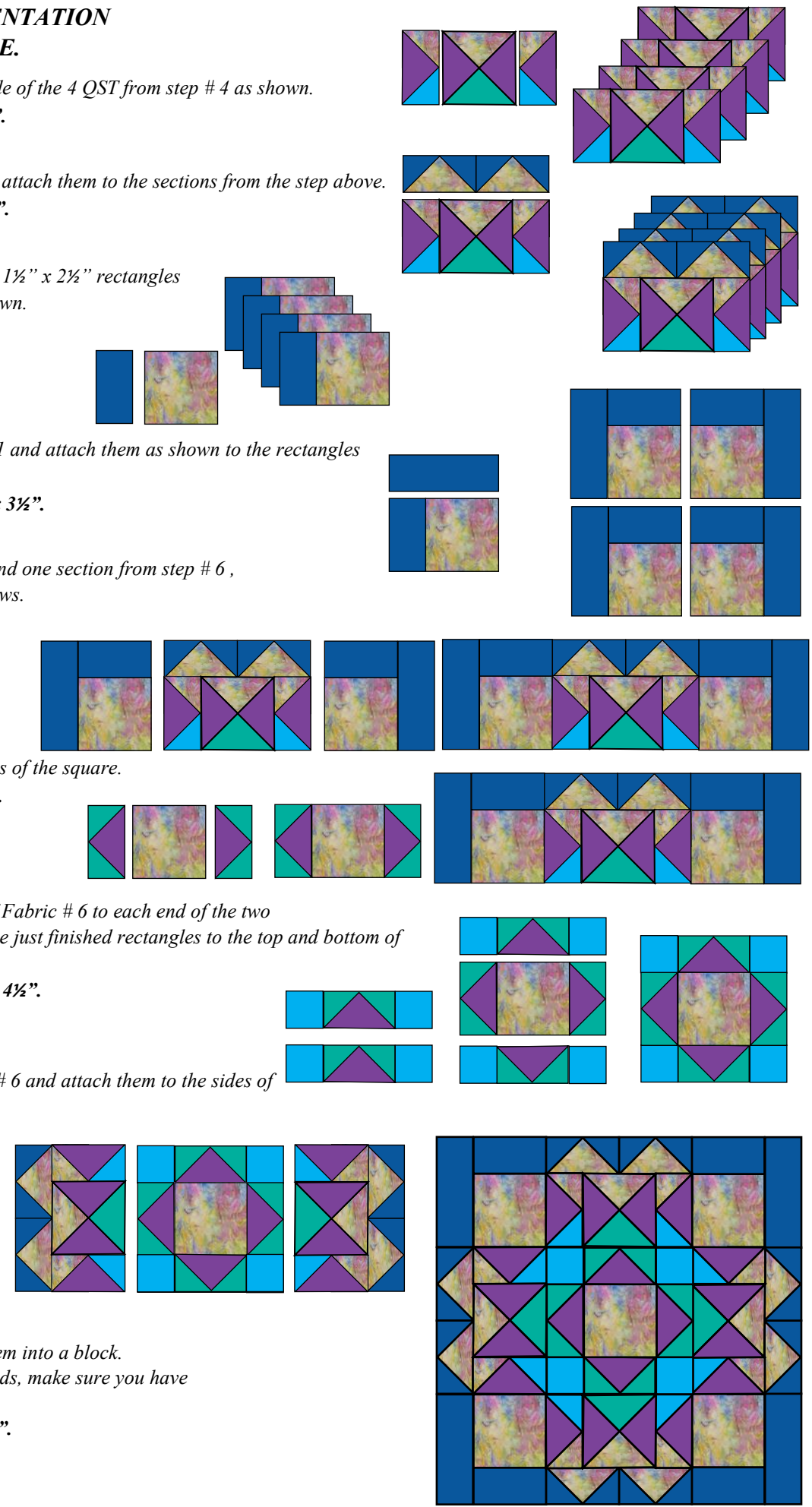
- Attach one FG from step # 3E to each side of the 4 QST from step # 4 as shown.
The sections should measure 2½" x 4½".
- Take the 4 pairs of FG from step # 1 and attach them to the sections from the step above.
Each section should measure 3½" x 4½".
- Take 4 - 2½" squares of Fab. # 3 and 4 - 1½" x 2½" rectangles of Fab. # 1 and sew them together as shown.
Each should measure 2½" x 3½".
- Take 4 - 1½" x 3½" rectangles of Fab. # 1 and attach them as shown to the rectangles from the step above.
Each corner unit should measure 3½" x 3½".
- Take the 2 top corner units from above and one section from step # 6, sew the 3 sections into a row. Make 2 rows.
Each row should measure 3½" x 10½".

- Take 1 - 2½" square of Fab. # 3 and attach 2 FG from step # 2 to the sides of the square.
This section should measure 2½" x 4½".

- Attach 1 - 1½" square (corner stones) of Fabric # 6 to each end of the two remaining FG from step # 2. Then sew the just finished rectangles to the top and bottom of the center square from step # 10.
The block center should measure 4½" x 4½".

- Take the 2 remaining sections from step # 6 and attach them to the sides of the block center.
This row should measure 4½" x 10½".

- Lay out the 3 rows as shown and sew them into a block.
Clean the edges and trim any loose threads, make sure you have a ¼" seam allowance on all points.
This block should measure 10½" x 10½".



Cutting:

Fab. # 1

- 8 - 2" squares
- 4 - 1½" x 2½" rectangles
- 4 - 1½" x 3½" rectangles

Fab. # 3

- 3 - 3½" squares
- 5 - 2½" squares
- 4 - 2" squares

Fab. # 6

- 4 - 2" squares
- 4 - 1½" squares

Fab. # 12

- 5 - 3½" squares

Fab. # 13

- 1 - 3½" square
- 4 - 2" squares
